Development, and Restoration*

OUTREACH

Victory meets immediate needs through programs like our Mobile Food Pantry, Emergency Shelter, Life Together Case Management, Life Institute Workshops and Classes, and Street Outreach. Our team of case managers meet men and women who find us through these programs and invite people to do life together with Victory Mission.

PRAY FOR OUTREACH

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. (Matt. 7:7-8, NIV)

A majority of people who are homeless in Springfield, MO reported struggling with both mental health and substance use. Most of our men reported dealing with depression, anxiety, substance use, and trauma. Please pray for salvation, healing, and a renewed mind.

Join us in prayer that Street Outreach may be powerful and effective—that we may have wisdom, love, and boldness while making genuine connections with people that lead to life change.

Pray for the families and individuals we connect with at our Mobile Pantry sites. Ask for God to help them build meaningful relationships with church partners in their neighborhoods and our Life Together team. Ask Him to instill hope for a way out of the situations driving the crisis.

Pray for more steps of incremental change for families we meet through our Mobile Food Pantry, men staying in our Emergency and Transitional Shelters, and individuals met during Street Outreach.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Victory equips individuals with the skills they need to be successful in the workforce. This is accomplished through programs such as Jobs for Life, WorkReady BootCamp, Internships, Mentorships, Classes, Apprenticeships, and our social enterprise, Equip Coffee.

PRAY FOR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. (John 14:13, NIV)

Ask God to transform hearts and minds to recognize God's design for humanity to use our gifts and talents to subdue and steward the earth and worship Him through work.

We believe every life has immeasurable value. Pray for men and women to recognize their worth and ability to be fruitful in the eyes of Jesus as they begin to set goals for their future careers.

Pray that God would help individuals overcome roadblocks such as incarceration, transportation, employment history, confidence, and more as they search for meaningful job opportunities.

We encourage our participants to pursue lifelong careers. As they are hired in the community, pray for them to persevere through challenging situations and maintain long-term employment.

Pray for our local employment partners, who interview and often hire our program participants. Ask God to help them as they support and guide individuals who are re-entering the workforce.

RESTORATION

We desire to encourage lifelong Victory for those we serve. Designed to transform lives through a *wholistic* and relational approach, the Restoration Program is a 12-18 month residential rehabilitation program. We seek to help restore 5 key areas of life: spiritual, vocational, personal, relational, and financial.

PRAY FOR RESTORATION

Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen. (Eph. 3:20-21, NKJV)

Ask God to prepare hearts and minds to be transformed and find new life in Jesus Christ. Pray for more men and women who are ready to enter the Restoration Program to find Victory Mission.

Pray for God's help in overcoming personal challenges and connecting men and women to the resources and relationships they need. Ask Him for healing and recovery from substance abuse, mental illness, and abuse.

Pray for the restoration of families and other important relationships. Ask God to help men and women develop healthy relationships and find community within the body of Christ.

Ask God to transform the vocational lives of men and women in Restoration. Pray for meaningful careers and attitudes of service and worship.

Pray for the financial aspects of Restoration. Ask God for guidance as men and women learn to steward their resources and serve their communities with their finances.

JACOB AUSTIN

After a fight with his mom, Jacob left home at the age of 11. He lived on the streets, started doing drugs, and robbing people. Jacob met his children's mom at the age of 19, and she became pregnant with their first child. In 2018, he ended up in prison for a first-degree robbery. After a year in prison, Jacob came to Victory Mission. He left the program and moved in with a girl, only to find himself using drugs again and back in prison. From there, he re-entered Victory's Restoration Program. As a violent offender, Jacob believed he would never regain parental rights. Because of his progress while at Victory Mission, after a series of court dates, he began to have visits and phone calls with his kids. Today, he has full custody of his children.

MICHAEL HAYES

When Michael was 12 years old, he started smoking cigarettes and marijuana, which quickly led to painkillers and alcohol. When he was 22, he was married. Michael shares that his relationship with his wife was toxic—full of fighting and revolving drug use. When his marriage fell apart, Michael moved in with his brother Matthew. Soon after, Matthew went to prison. After he was out of prison, Michael noticed that everything was different about Matthew. This intrigued Michael. Matthew encouraged Michael to come to Victory Mission, where he rebuilt his life after prison. "I know you want more," Matthew shared. Michael decided to join the Restoration Program. Much like his brother, Michael has found joy, peace, and new life in Christ.

NOAH HUSKEY

Noah came to Victory Mission after being incarcerated. Before that, he had been homeless, was addicted to heroin, and lost custody of his children. Noah shared, "I didn't think change was possible for me." His intent was to stay at Victory long enough to get what he needed—food and a place to sleep. Then, he'd get a job, a little bit of money, and take off. Noah assumed he'd always return to addiction. He'd be in and out of prison for the rest of his life. Noah arrived at Victory Mission and everything changed. Noah encountered God differently than he had before. He began to realize he was no longer a victim of his circumstances. Instead, he found victory in Christ. Noah's life has been transformed.

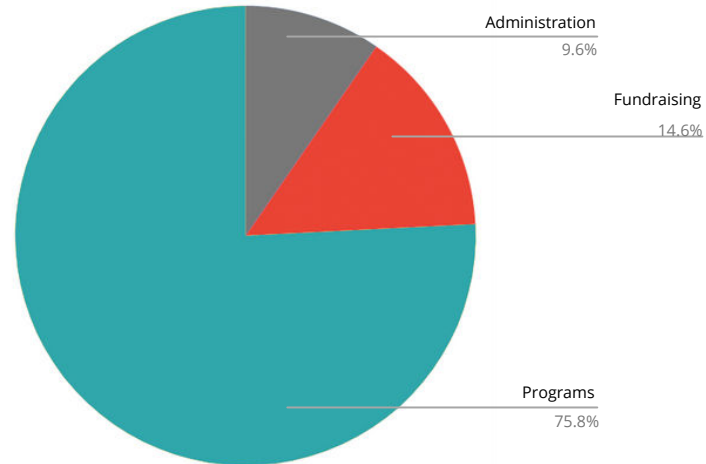

PROGRAMS



RESTORATION PROGRAM

The Restoration Program is a 12-18 month discipleship program designed to transform men and women's lives through a holistic approach in five areas: spiritual, personal, relational, vocational, and financial.



EMERGENCY SHELTER

Victory allows men to stay for up to 30 days every six months. Residential program fees are waived through scholarships. Through case management, men are encouraged to pursue employment and to become involved with a local church. All guests are encouraged to attend classes or participate in the WorkReady BootCamp at the WorkReady Center. *Men's Shelter Open 24/7*



TRANSITIONAL SHELTER

Victory provides an affordable housing alternative to pay-by-the-week hotels and substandard housing as men transition into a state of independence. Residential program fees are between \$13 and \$16. *Located at the Men's Shelter*



WORKREADY BOOTCAMP

The WorkReady Bootcamp is a week-long course which helps men in the emergency shelter gain the skills they need to find meaningful employment and live independent lives. Men who graduate the BootCamp are interviewed by local employers. The average starting wage is \$14 per hour. *Located at the WorkReady Center*



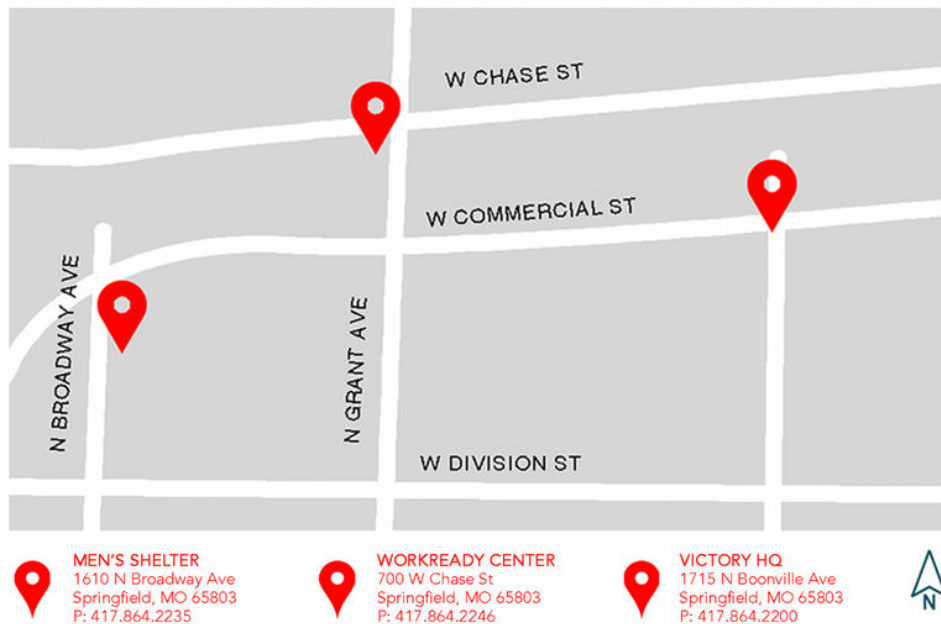
LIFE TOGETHER

The Life Together Program connects men and women in challenging circumstances with Life Together Coaches. Coaches help participants connect with the resources they need to change the trajectory of their lives and give them hope for lifelong sustainability.



MOBILE PANTRY

Victory Mission travels to neighborhoods to meet the immediate needs of families facing food insecurity. Each pantry guest is connected with a Life Together Case Manager. Victory provides support and resources that instill hope for a way out of the situations driving the crisis. *Find current times and locations at victorymission.com/pantry.*
